GENERAL SKILLS

- Good judgment, common sense, high ethical standards and integrity,
- Basic understanding of administrative justice and the essential elements of conducting fair and objective hearings or expertise in running public meetings or quasi-judicial hearings,
- Appreciation of the responsibilities to the public, and a keen sense of fairness and respect for all,
- Ability to ask questions in a non-confrontational or judgmental manner, and
- Effective communication skills, including superior analytic and writing skills, and an ability to listen to, digest and analyze a large volume of evidence.

LAWYERS

- Administrative law experience including appearing before administrative tribunals or previous experience as a member of a tribunal,
- Administrative or Health Law specialization, litigation, and/or civil procedure experience,
- Knowledge of the principles of administrative fairness and natural justice, and
- Current experience in adjudication and decision writing.

OTHER MINISTERIAL SELECTIONS

- Administrative law experience including appearing before administrative tribunals or previous experience as a member of a tribunal,
- Knowledge of the principles of administrative fairness and natural justice,
- Some previous background and experience in the health field (eg. Medical training, hospital administration or governance expertise, or nursing experience), and
- Dispute resolution training and expertise in mediation and conflict resolution.
